Bosler Memorial Library Closed an Additional Day

(Carlisle, PA) – In addition to August 6-11, Bosler Memorial Library will be closed one additional day, Monday, August 13, 2012 to move the contents of the library to its newly constructed South Wing. The library plans to reopen on Tuesday, August 14, 2012 at 10 am for regular business.

Originally, the library planned to be closed August 6-11 so that library staff could move the books, furnishings and computers from the original buildings, the East and West Wings, to the newly completed South Wing. However, the move and related construction issues are taking longer than expected. So, library staff will continue to work through the weekend and Monday, August 13, 2012 to ensure a smooth opening for the public on Tuesday, August 14, 2012.

The library's exterior drops for books and audiovisual items on West High Street will remain open throughout the closure. Items returned in the drops during this time will not be checked in by the library until Tuesday, August 14, 2012. However, any fines that accrued on items returned in the drops during August 6-13 will be waived when the library reopens on August 14.

In addition, online services, such as research databases, the online catalog, and digital downloads, will remain available throughout the closure.

When the library reopens on Tuesday, August 14, at 10:00 am, the public will use the newly constructed South Wing of Bosler Memorial Library. The parking lot will also re-open and the book and audiovisual drops will relocate from West High Street to the parking lot.

For the next six months, while the original East Wing and West Wings of the building are remodeled, all library customers will enter the library via the new parking lot entrance, accessible from the rear of the library off Church Avenue. The West High Street entrance will remain closed through December 2012 until construction is complete.
