Employee of the Month nominations are open to the public and celebrate outstanding customer service. Exemplary Library System employees are nominated by patrons, peers, and co-workers. Genevieve and Logan were nominated by their coworker, Nicholas Macri.

In his nomination of the Bosler Community Relations staff, Nick writes, “As Bosler’s Outreach Specialist, Genevieve will mostly be found out in the community with our “Bosler on the Go” van and Edgar Allan Penguin. She represents the library at community events and gatherings and does an exceptional job ensuring Bosler’s booth is engaging and interactive for attendees. This includes games, science activities, library card registrations, free books, and much more. Genevieve ensures the library is represented at a variety of events in Bosler’s service area, including: the Carlisle Barracks Welcome Expo, the Employment Skills Center Downtown Mile, Carlisle School District Kindergarten Registration, the YMCA Healthy Kids Day, Hope Station’s Black Cultural Festival, Craighead House Falconry Day, National Night Out, Easter egg hunts, trunk or treat events, and many more. Genevieve also works with the Carlisle Tool Library and Carlisle Arts Learning Center on the upkeep and management of the Bosler Free Libraries scattered around the Carlisle area. Genevieve works to bring the library to the communities we serve, instead of waiting for them to come into the library.”

The nomination continues, “As Bosler’s Community Relations Assistant, Logan is instrumental in the success of the Carlisle Institute for Lifelong Learning at Bosler. Logan does an amazing job finding different presenters and partners for various educational talks and programs at the library. This includes working with the Cumberland County Historical Society to provide free local history talks, working with the YWCA of Cumberland and

Adams Counties on an educational series of important social issues, partnering with the South Mountain HAM Radio Club on an annual course for patrons to learn about radios, collaborating with the Cumberland County CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) on an information series to help attendees be more prepared in emergencies, and in the past partnering with the Carlisle Tool Library, PA Department of Banking, PA Insurance Department, and many more. He also identifies local authors, businesses, and individuals to provide free educational programming through the Carlisle Institute for Lifelong Learning.”

In addition to their primary responsibilities, Genevieve and Logan work to generate content for Bosler’s social media, plan engaging library scavenger hunts, design library promotional materials, and much more. You’ll also occasionally find Genevieve at Bosler’s Information Services Desk and Logan at Bosler’s Public Services Desk. They are both always helpful and willing to assist any department at Bosler.

Bosler’s Community Relations Department has a multitude of functions and responsibilities and is continually growing and evolving. The primary goal of the Community Relations Department, though, is to work collaboratively and in partnership with the community that Bosler aims to serve.
